OVERVIEW

1. Objectives

- A. Strengthening youth exchanges between ASEAN and Korea by forming solidarity and intimate relationship
- B. Strengthening global capabilities through topic-related activities and exchanges of shared views and opinions among youths from 11 countries of ASEAN and Korea
- C. Providing opportunities for youth contribution to the development of the ASEAN-Korea community by exploring a common agenda and drawing cooperative measures
- D. Regularizing the event as the representative international exchange involving youths from ASEAN and Korea through successful and meaningful events

2. Background

- A. The need for promoting exchanges in the youth sector has emerged as a result of improving the level of cooperation with ASEAN, including the implementation of the New Southern Policy since 2017
- B. Emphasis of participation and cooperation in the youth sector through Article 26 of Co-Chairs' Statement of the 2019 ASEAN-Republic of KOREA Commemorative Summit (Article 26 acknowledges that ASEAN and the ROK continue youth exchanges, strengthening youth cooperation)
- C. Establishing online events as an alternative measure to holding offline events due to the limitations by current situation with COVID-19

3. Date and Venue

- A. Date: $25^{th} \sim 27^{th}$ November, 2020
- B. Venue: Seoul, Republic of Korea (Online)
- 4. Theme: Togetherness of ASEAN-Korean Youth, for the future of ASEAN-Korean Community

* 3 categories and topics

- A. (**People**) Future-oriented Community Collaboration and Youth Exchanges between ASEAN and Korea
 - Topic 1: Exchange and Development through Manifestations of ASEAN Core Values: Communitarianism
- Topic 2: Personal Exchange beyond Geographical Borders for Fellowship: Focusing on Youth Interactions
- B. (Peace) Harmony of ASEAN-Korean Cultural Diversities and Cooperation for the Future
- Topic 3: Understanding and Overcoming Individual/Group/Community-level Discrimination, Isolation and Injustice (e.g. gender discrimination, generation gap, etc.)

- Topic 4 : Social Integration and Peace-making Efforts through the Lens of Functions and Dysfunctions of Digital Media

C. (Prosperity) Co-Prosperity of ASEAN-Korea and Youth Responsibility

- Topic 5 : Sharing Activities ("Nanum") for Co-Prosperity: No Citizen Left Behind for Solidarity
- Topic 6 : Global Citizenship Education for "Inclusion and Inclusiveness"

- A. Youths of ASEAN nationality
- B. Youths between the ages of 18 and 24 with strong interest and knowledge in the topics
- C. Youths who have a good command of English (official language for the event)

- D. Youths who can attend the full program including pre-activities (required)
 - * Pre-activities: 1) Second week of October
 - 2) Nov.02: 2 hours between 3~7pm (TBD)
 - 3) Nov.23: 2 hours between 3~7pm (TBD)
 - 4) Nov.24: 2 hours between 3~7pm (TBD)
 - * Official programs: **Nov.25-27**
- E. Youths who submit School Recommendation Letter (**preferred**)
- F. Youths who have relevant work experience(s) or activities regarding the theme: Togetherness of ASEAN-Korean Youth, for the Future of ASEAN-Korean Community (**preferred**)

8. Program Modality

- A. There are two types of participation for youths from the 10 ASEAN Member States

 <u>Type 1:</u> Youths from Brunei Darussalam (TBC), Cambodia, Lao PDR, Malaysia, Myanmar,

 Thailand, Vietnam will be participating in the pre-activities and the official program

 between 23-27 November 2020 at the following designated locations.
 - Brunei Darussalam: Universiti Brunei Darussalam (TBC)
 - Cambodia: Royal University of Phnom Penh
 - Lao PDR: National University of Laos
 - Malaysia: University of Malaya
 - Myanmar: University of Yangon
 - Thailand: Mahidol University
 - Vietnam: Vietnam National University, Hanoi
 - **Type 2:** In conformity with the policies and regulations of the governments and universities in Indonesia, Philippines, and Singapore against the COVID-19, youths in these countries will be engaged in the program via online from their residences or any other places secured with an internet connection.
- B. For the youths Type 1, the local host universities will be responsible for the arrangements of accommodation, air fare (if applicable), meals, meeting facilities, technical assistance, etc. during the pre-activities and official program on 23-27 November 2020.
- C. For the youths Type 2, the MOGEF will provide USD150 for individual participant from Indonesia, Philippines, Singapore as a support cost. The amount will be transferred to the participant's bank account after the end of the event.

- A. We will provide a certificate of participation after each participant successfully attends the summit.
- B. We will send a set of gifts to participants after the summit.**However those who do not show full attendance in the activities may not receive the gifts.
