Students who wish to undertake research at the graduate school must search for a supervisor suitable for their research theme using the KANSAI UNIVERSITY System for Academic Information and submit a research plan (in either Japanese or English) at the time of application.  *Graduate courses will not be opened if there are no regular students to take a course of a relevant graduate school.  *Regarding acceptance at the graduate level, acceptance may be refused at the discretion of the supervisors due to inconsistency in research content. In that case, please note that students will be accepted at the undergraduate level.

7. Visa Information		
Procedures for Obtaining a Student Visa	Kansai University will obtain a Certificate of Eligibility (COE) and send it to the student's home university. With the COE, exchange students can apply for a "Student" visa at the nearest Japanese embassy or consulate overseas.	
Permission for Undertaking a Part-time Job	If students apply for work permission, they will be able to work part-time and receive remuneration despite their status as "Student" (please note that they can only work for 28 hours per week). If they are planning to work part-time in Japan, they must apply for work permission.	
Status of Residence After Completing the Exchange Program	Even if the residence card is still valid at the time of program completion, students must return to their home country by September 20th for the Spring semester and by March 31st for the Fall semester. Please be noted that students are obliged to hand in the soft copy of their flight ticket for returning home before leaving Japan as well as the invalid residence card after returning home as Kansai University manages international students' status of residence pursuant to Article 19 (17) of the Immigration Control and Refugee Recognition Act and the Notice on Appropriate Acceptance and Registration Management of International Students from the Ministry of Education, Culture, Sports, Science and Technology.  In addition, Kansai University will not support students to change their status of residence other than "Student".
