



Memorandum of Understanding

Between

The Law Faculty of Chiang Mai University (LAWCMU), a public law school located at 239 Huay Kaew Road, Muang District, Chiang Mai, Thailand 50200

And

Environmental Law Centre Society (ELC), University of Victoria, a non-profit society that operates Canada's largest and oldest public interest environmental law clinic in partnership with the University of Victoria, Faculty of Law located at Murray and Anne Fraser Building, University of Victoria, Victoria, BC, Canada, V8W 2Y2.

In accordance of a mutual desire to promote environmental justice and teaching environmental law in law school, LAWCMU and ELC enter into this Memorandum of Understanding.

Article I. Purpose

LAWCMU and ELC enter into this Memorandum of Understanding for the purpose of affirming our commitment to working collaboratively to exchange knowledge and experience between two parties.

Article II. Commitments

To further this mutual commitment, the parties accordingly mutually acknowledge and agree that:

1. ELC will help LAWCMU to establish an environmental legal clinic in Chiang Mai University.
2. ELC will help LAWCMU to develop an environmental legal clinic curriculum.
3. ELC will introduce LAWCMU to prospect funding.

The Law Faculty of Chiang Mai University, Thailand

- 1. LAWCMU will exchange knowledge and experience with ELC staff and students.
- 2. LAWCMU will connect ELC staff and students to indigenous people, Thai civil society and other Thai organizations as required.
- 3. LAWCMU will collaborate with ELC in research and teaching.
